What is WETAP?

Wisconsin Employment Transportation Assistance Program

- To provide employment transportation to low-income residents to jobs or job-related locations (education, childcare, training, etc.)
- Statewide
- Projects operate for one calendar year
- State and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds are used



Eligible WETAP Organizations and Projects

- Non-profit organizations in Wisconsin
 - May have for-profit or other partnerships
- Filling gaps in public transit service
 - Vanpool and Carpool service
 - Vehicle repair and/or purchase loans
 - Vouchers (taxi service, human service agency, etc.)
 - Admin, Operating, and Mobility Manager staff positions



Ineligible WETAP Organizations and Projects

For Profit Businesses and Local Public Bodies
These types of organizations can partner with a non-profit for a

• Vehicle or capital purchases, gas vouchers, driver's license recovery, and bicycle programs.



Funding Gaps in WETAP








2021 Projects and Coverage

Application Process

- Projects operate on a calendar year (Jan 1st to December 31st)
- Typically, applications open in October-ish and close in November-ish
- Applications done online through our BlackCat Grants
 Management System
 - Submit contact info to me or Judy to get into system
